ISA Withdrawal Policy:
Withdrawals after March 15, 2023: 75 days prior to departure - student will be liable for full ISU faculty support, 15% ISA program fees, and any other non-refundable costs from ISA.

Program Dates:

Depart U.S: June 1, 2023
Arrive: June 2, 2023;
Return to US: June 24, 2023

Withdrawals after April 2, 2023: 60 days prior to departure - student will be liable for full ISU faculty support, 50% ISA program fees, any airfare penalties, and any other non-refundable costs from ISA.

ISA/Worldstrides Payment Deadlines:

Deposit due by February 21, 2023 - 15% of Program Fee; \$200 for Group Air
Second payment due March 3, 2023 - 50% of the total remaining program fee
Final payment due April 17, 2023 - 100% of the total remaining program fee

Withdrawals after March 15, 2023: 30 days prior to departure - student will be liable for full ISU faculty support, 100% ISA program fees and airfare, as well as any other non-refundable costs from ISA.
