

## EXPLANATION OF TERMS AND CODES

The following explanation of each of these terms will be helpful in reading the Course Equivalency lists.

<u>TERM</u>	<u>EXPLANATION</u>
Specific Course Title	Course is an approved equivalent to the identified ISU course.
Course A + Course B = Course C (Combination of 2 or more courses required. Highlighted in yellow)	Both courses must be taken in order to receive credit for the identified ISU course. Elective credit will be awarded if only one of those courses are taken.
Courses with " <u>OR</u> " or " <u>AND</u> "	Multiple ISU equivalent options are approved by that department or by the Registrar's office. Ask your advisor which one is best for you.
MAJOR ELECTIVE	Courses will transfer as hours toward graduation and will be counted in that specific major IF pre-approved by your major advisor.
NON-MAJOR ELECTIVE	Course will not fulfill major requirements, but will transfer as hours toward graduation.
NO CREDIT	Course will not be awarded credit in any way.
Global Studies/Science, Mathematics, & Technology courses ( <b>A/S Column</b> )	This course will fulfill the Global Studies graduation requirement, indicated with " <b>A</b> " or the Science, Mathematics, & Technology course for B.S. Degrees, indicated with " <b>S</b> "
ISU General Education-old (Gen. Ed.) <b>*for freshmen admitted Summer 1998-Spring 2014*</b>	The approved Gen. Ed. code will be listed. See your major advisor or your catalog for more information.
ISU General Education-new (GE14) <b>*for freshmen admitted Summer 2014-present*</b>	The approved GE14 code will be listed. See your major advisor or the 2014-16 catalog for more information.
IL Articulation Initiative General Ed. (IAI) <b>*for almost all transfer students*</b>	The approved IAI code will be listed. See your major advisor or your catalog for more information.
IGE Code ( <b>teaching majors only</b> )	The approved IGE code will be listed. See your major advisor for more information.

NOTE: Lower-division undergraduate courses at ISU are numbered 100-199. Senior-college undergraduate courses at ISU are numbered 200-399.
